## 'INDIAN EDUCATION SYSTEM: INTELLECTUAL MUSINGS'

Prof. G. HaraGopal spoke on recent trends and Challenges in the Indian higher education system as part of larger global trends and the need for reorienting the Indian education system to suit the needs and aspirations of the poor, instead of general market based needs.



He stressed the need for active involvement of teachers as primary. Stakeholders to bring about necessary changes in the Indian higher education system.
