The students are shown their answer scripts and discussion on the academic performance is initiated. Supplementary examinations/Recounting/Revaluation: Students have the right to seek clarification /revaluation in case of any deviation from the marking scheme displayed. Academic Calendar: The examination facilitates the conduct of continuous internal evaluation (CIE) and Semester end examinations (SEE) in accordance with the almanac of Satavahana University. Full transparency in all the processes is observed right from the announcement of the examinations up to the declaration of the results.
