Academic Year: 2019-2020

Based on the analysis of the Student Feedback Report, the following measures have been initiated:

1. Since 95 percent of the student respondents were satisfied (strongly agreed and agreed) with the relevance of the syllabus to the course, it was resolved to continue with the curriculum.
2. About 88 percent of the students expressed their opinion that the present curriculum was helpful in finding employment and 12 per cent of them felt otherwise. Similarly, 75% of the teachers, 94 % each of Alumni and Parents opined that the syllabus was useful in obtaining employment. It was resolved to focus on introducing skill oriented courses which have the potential to improve the chances of employment. For this, the Telangana Skills and Knowledge Centre of the college is to be strengthened with a special focus on employability skills like Communication skills, Soft skills, Analytical skills and Aptitude skills.
3. Most of the students (68 %) observed that the syllabus was challenging. The remaining 32 % of them expressed that the syllabus needs to be more dynamic. As this Institution is an affiliated college under Osmania University, it does not have a say in upgrading or modifying the syllabus. However, it was resolved that the faculty members who are part of Board of Studies in their respective subjects shall suggest to the university authorities to make necessary changes. It was also decided to organize more number of extension lectures to incorporate fresh concepts to make the syllabus more competent and challenging.
4. A majority of students (71 %) remarked that the study material is available in abundance for the course contents. For the students who still felt that the material is inadequate, it has been decided to download the study material from the internet and make it available in the library/departments for further reference. The other stakeholders agreed to the aforesaid suggestion.
5. About 67 % of students agreed that the prescribed books were available in the library and market. To satisfy the needs of all the students, it has been resolved to augment library resources with prescribed books. It was decided to automate the library so as to make available e-resources/contents to the students. Our library is equipped with about 4827 textbooks of Telugu Academy, Reference Books and other publications for the benefit of students and staff.
6. A majority of the students (69 %) opined that innovative and creative strategies were adopted in teaching and learning process. For this, teachers have been instructed to constantly update their skills, incorporate novel methods to be adopted in the teaching process. They have been advised to prepare Powerpoint presentations, stream videos. Accordingly, the infrastructure will be strengthened to make the teachers use modern,

state of art technologies like e-classrooms, smart boards, projectors, models and other equipment.
