#### Nalgonda at a Glance

The history of the town of Nalgonda dates back to centuries and has stood all through an iconic symbol of the culture of the Telangana region in ways more than one. Many political, revolutionary and literary movements which have acquired a national, for that matter an international acknowledge, till recent times are initialized here. After the formation the Telangana state by revival four years and a half ago, one of the southern Indian states now, the erstwhile district of Nalgonda is divided into two when all the districts in the state have been reorganized henceforward. And yet no less bulk now in size, as the head quarters of the district, it administers over a number of mandals, that is, the administrative sub-divisions in the district. The town long since has been under the Municipal administration locally. Situated at the foot of two hillocks, hillock meaning 'konda', prefixed with 'nalla' meaning 'black', the name 'Nallakonda' had acquired currency and came into voque, and in course of time has now come to be established as 'Nalgonda'. Much earlier it was known as 'Neelagiri', the two terms 'neela' and 'giri' too put together meaning much less the same nomenclature. There is archaeological evidence that man in Paleolithic period lived in this region, and fashioned tools and weapons out of stone. Some such implements are said to have been found in and out of the town of Nalgorida, resembling those discovered at Sloan archaeological site in Arkansas. A recorded political history of the Nalgonda region is said to have commenced with the Mourvas, During the reign of Asoka the Great, the Mouryas exercised control over the region. Later, the Satavahanas, who ruled between 230 BC and 218 BC, took control of the area. During this period, the region established trade contacts with the Roman Empire. And then it was the Chalukva dynasty which took control of this part of the state.

As the district head quarters, Nalgonda serves as a hub of Primary, Secondary and Higher education, facilitating educational opportunities also to the seekers of education from around the town, Telugu and Urdu, apart from English as mediums of instruction. The District Head Quarters also houses a state level University named after Mahatma Gandhi, in addition to numerous colleges of Engineering, Vocational Education, Paramedical Sciences, etc.
